
Pennsylvania • County Reports 2021

ALICE IN JUNIATA COUNTY


ALICE is an acronym for **A**sset **L**imited,

Income Constrained, Employed — households that earn more than the Federal Poverty Level, but less than the basic cost of living for the county. While conditions have improved for some households, many continue to struggle, especially as wages fail to keep pace with the rising cost of household essentials (housing, child care, food, transportation, health care, and a basic smartphone plan). Households below the ALICE Threshold — ALICE households plus those in poverty — can't afford the essentials.



As circumstances change, households may find themselves below or above the ALICE Threshold at different times. While the COVID-19 pandemic brought employment shifts, health struggles, and school/business closures in 2021, it also

spurred unprecedented public assistance through pandemic relief measures. In 2019, 1,902,886 households in Pennsylvania were below the ALICE Threshold; by 2021 that number had changed to 2,044,773.



future goals like college or retirement. In 2021, household costs in every county in Pennsylvania were well above the

Federal Poverty Level of \$12,880 for a single adult and \$26,500 for a family of four.
